We helped promote the good work of NGOs

We maintained and updated our database of 350 organisations across Karnataka. We helped the Rotary Club of Bangalore select their Annual NGO Awards winners; and Times Foundation (Bangalore) in establishing the systems for their awards. Our website www.bangalorecares.in was made more interactive.



We assisted NGOs in raising funds

The World 10K Run has become a major annual platform for NGOs to raise funds and make friends. The event is organised by Procam International. Bangalore Cares is the platform through which NGOs register, run, and raise funds through companies, their employees, and from individuals and their friends. Held on 23 May, 2010, the event saw 21,000 citizens and 108 NGOs participate; Rs 1.41 crore was raised. Since the event started in 2008, over 100 NGOs have raised Rs 3.12 crore.





The World 10K Run (W 10K) saw 20 companies supported the NGOs. The companies were (in alphabetical order) Accenture, BESCOM, Cox & Kings, Ernst & Young, Fidelity, Hinduja Global, HSBC Bank, Johnson & Johnson, KPMG, Nike, Northern Trust, SAP, SSGA, Thoughtworks, and Titan.



-The start up and development of Bangalore Cares

In 1999, four individuals – GM Row, Sunil Abraham, Satish, and Murray Culshaw. attached with four organisations: Rotary International District 3190, Mahiti. Madhuvan, and Murray Culshaw Advisory Services respectively – came together to support the NGO community in Karnataka. After inception, our activities included collaborating with NGOs to produce a directory listing of the sector; organising Seva Setu – large-scale meetings for government officials, companies, and NGOs to come together: and assisted Rotary Bangalore West with their Annual NGO Awards. During this period, we did not employ staff; all initiatives were around volunteering.

In 2008, Bangalore Cares became more active and had the opportunity to become the 'Charity Partner' for the annual World 10K. This meant collaborating with Procam International (the event organisers) to engage NGOs to raise funds by utilising the opportunity. We took on staff and registered as a trust in 2009.

The start-up of our activities is reflected in the financial statements beside this page.



Our turnover for the year 2008-09 was less than Rs 2 lakh; by March 2011, we had reached Rs 33 lakh this included Rs 22 lakh being passed on to NGOs. In addition, furthermore during the year 2010-2011, the NGOs directly raised an additional Rs 1.1 crore, predominately through participation in the World 10K. We expect that by March 2012, our turnover will be Rs 50 lakh of which we will pass Rs 30 lakh to NGOs; further, the NGO commnunity will raise an additional Rs 1.5 crore with the support of Bangalore Cares.

We now have ambitious plans for growth.

Our plans for the future

Our activities are under four categories:

- Information gathering and sharing: this implies gathering data on the NGO sector, predominately in Karnataka; making information available through a directory and on our website.
- Improving NGO services: through skillbuilding workshops and sharing of expertise between NGOs and others who are willing to share.
- Increasing NGO income: through events like the World 10K; the Joy of Giving Week; and an e-waste project.
- Ensuring accountability: by promoting the standards of the Credibility Alliance

 a national NGO based in Mumbai. The Alliance has established norms for public disclosure and good governance in the sector.

An important element of our approach is to collaborate with similar or related organisations. For example: GuideStar India, which is building a national database of NGOs; Give India, largest online giving portal in the country; iVolunteer, which facilitates corporate volunteering; Global Giving International, an online portal based in the US; and Rotary Clubs in Bangalore.
